Members will be expected to arrange their own transport and/or accommodation for the weekend. With two months still to go before the event, take advantage of booking early - travel to Saint Germain couldn't be easier. Paris can be reached by Eurostar to Gare du Nord (even for a day round-trip). Otherwise, by plane to Roissy-Charles de Gaulle, Orly or even Beauvais Airports (check skyscanner.net for a quick price comparison).

For those looking for a more leisurely option, ferries operate to most major Channel ports. Once in Paris, Saint Germain en Laye sits in the western leafy

outer suburbs of Paris and can be reached by RER (regional express train) direct to the town. See the Access Map attached. Once in Saint Germain, visit the famous chateau, its open gardens including the English Garden, the old town and its many market squares, the Debussy museum, as well as the Saint Germain National Forest and the Seine. It's also a good base for visiting Paris and other nearby towns.
